Google recently updated its apps with three new features, which created chaos among tech giants. Joshua Dinnerman's it-techview.com report discusses the latest features released by Google.

These features are related to common problems that every mobile data user faces. Maybe some of you may know that Google has an Android app named **Datally**, which helps users monitor and control their data usage. Google has updated this app to control data usage and to help its users get more space on their devices. Here are the latest features that Google has added to the app.

- Most people do not know that at least 20% of their mobile data is consumed by the apps running in the background, even if they haven't used those apps for more than a month. Datally identifies those apps and lets the user uninstall them with one tap. Or you could just leave them installed, depending on your choice.
- Whenever you are in an open area, your phone is scanning for open networks. But how do you know whether that open network is safe to use or not, or even where that network is? Datally now has a Wi-Fi map that lets the user identify nearby open networks, and it also suggests which networks are safe to join or not.
- Have you ever noticed how much mobile data you are consuming every day? Datally's third new feature keeps track of your daily data usage. Moreover, you can set a data limit as well, so whenever you're close to exceeding your limit the app will send you a warning notification. It's up to you whether you ignore that warning or want to continue capping your data usage for the rest of the day.
